Formation Corner

Community Life: Working Together

We would like to share with you a brief peek into a portion of our cloistered life, which is probably not the first thing that comes to mind when you think of "Poor Clares of Perpetual Adoration", and this is: WORK.

Some of you are familiar with our Bread and Soup sales, and many of you have assisted us through the years. Behind the scenes the preparation for these days is immense, and yes, those days can be hectic, somewhat chaotic, and tiring. Yet, there is a particular joy in working together, which in Franciscan lingo would be "the grace of work."

At its highest level, it is a participation in "the work of God", which is Creation, and in the work undertaken and sanctified by Jesus, God made Man. This is passed along to us when we work harmoniously together: measuring, chopping, cooking, baking, making broth, picking chicken off the bone (don't leave any bones!), packaging, labeling, and last, but not least, cleaning up! In the midst of that bustling activity, there is the satisfaction of working toward and completing a goal, together, knowing that only with God's blessing will it become fruitful.

In another similar realm, Mother Mary Gertrude entrusted our courtyard gardens to the Sisters in Formation this year. This was Sister Joan Marie's great joy for many years, but as she declined, it did somewhat too. So, we began a "tame and reclaim" project, which has turned out quite lovely. Again, each Sister lending her talents and learning new ones while we discovered which plants worked in which areas (or didn't); how they actually grew (in contrast with the tiny pictures on the seed packets); and learned a few tricks of the trade from John, who keeps the public grounds so beautiful for the Sisters In all of this, we learn more about each other--and ourselves. We learn our talents and perhaps, some areas where we need to grow. We find out that we are God's Little Plants, as St. Francis referred to St. Clare, and that He loves and nurtures us and he calls us to do the same for one another.
